### Tips to make your HSC year successful

### Both the Year 11 and Year 12 pattern of study must include:

- 2 units of compulsory English
- at least 6 units of Board Developed Courses
- at least 3 courses of 2 units value or greater
- at least 4 subjects (including English)
- A maximum of 6 units of Science may be included in the Year 11 pattern of study
- A maximum of 7 units of Science may be included in the Year 12 pattern of study

### How is the HSC assessment mark determined?



### **School based assessment:**

- Number of tasks capped
  - 3 tasks in Year 11
  - 4 tasks in Year 12
  - task types suited to the course
  - one formal written examination style task option

# Accounts for half of the final HSC mark.

### **Moderation of assessment marks**

- All raw HSC assessment marks submitted by schools are moderated by NESA in a process called Moderation
- Moderation adjusts the raw assessments submitted by schools so that the mean (average) of the group's assessments is set to equal the mean of the HSC exam marks obtained by the group
- The top assessment mark is set to equal the top exam mark
- The rank order as submitted by the school of students remains unchanged in their group

Some courses use selection criteria other than, or in addition to, the ATAR. ### FAQ's

Why do some courses scale better than others?

Courses have to be scaled so that marks in different courses can be compared with each other. Courses are scaled using the mean scores and distribution of marks, which indicate the ability of the course candidature. Courses such as HSC Mathematics Extension 2 and Physics traditionally scale well because of this. However, students must achieve high HSC marks (and high positions) to gain any benefit from scaling.

- The underlying principle is that you should <u>neither be</u> <u>advantaged nor disadvantaged by choosing one course</u> <u>over another.</u>
- The scaling process is designed to encourage you to study courses you enjoy, are good at, and that best prepare you for future study – just about any combination of courses can lead to a good ATAR – but make sure you <u>understand eligibility rules</u>.

### **General aspects of the ATAR**

- The ATAR assists universities in RANKING (top to bottom) applicants for universities
- The best 10 units (2 of which could be a category B) of ATAR-eligible courses are used to determine your ATAR based on your performance vs. that of your peers. 2 units of English will be included
- The ATAR is calculated and released by the Universities Admissions Centre (UAC)
- The ATAR is a rank. It is not a mark.
- A student's ATAR indicates the POSITION of that student relative to their Year 7 cohort
- 2021 ATAR of 80.00 placed in top 20% of their Year 7 cohort if all the 2016 Year 7 students completed Year 12

### How does the scaling work?



Good rankings are more difficult to obtain when students are competing against students of high quality.

#### So.....

The scaling model adjusts HSC Marks to compensate for the "strength of the competition" by comparing the overall performance of each individual subject's cohort against each other to determine how they compare in relation to each other...

### The most common question:

# Why is my ATAR low compared to my Year 12 marks?

Scaling allows for your marks to be compared against not just those of other students in the same courses you studied, but also to the marks of other students in other courses...
