As a student, James represented our school with distinction at many levels, and it is our great pleasure to congratulate him on this latest achievement on the world swimming stage.

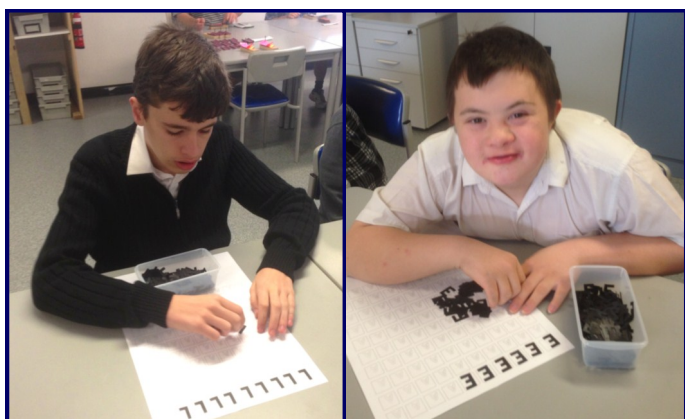
SPECIAL EDUCATION WORK EXPERIENCE PROGRAM

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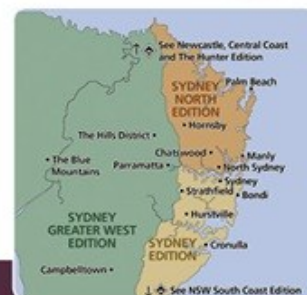
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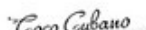
