DISTRIBUTION OF NAPLAN RESULTS

The Australian Curriculum, Assessment and Reporting Authority (ACARA) has advised that there will be a delay in the national distribution of NAPLAN Student Reports to schools. ACARA has identified an error in the placement of the national average marker in the Year 5 and 7 NAPLAN Student Reports for Language Conventions. ACARA is devising a strategy to address the issue, which will delay the distribution of Student Reports to schools. It is anticipated that the 2013 NAPLAN student reports will be delivered to schools across Australia from 8 -11 October with distribution of the reports to parents to occur in the week Monday 14 to Friday 18 October 2013.

SOCIETY DINING

On Tuesday 6 August, Year 11 Society and Culture students participated in a new cultural experience, enjoying an authentic Cantonese lunch at the famous Fook Yuen Yum Cha in Chatswood.

Equipped with the knowledge of how to eat according to Chinese dining etiquette and being all but fluent in the Cantonese language, some students still found the experience somewhat challenging. Jesse found using chopsticks without the aid of a spoon or fork quite difficult, while Will's brave attempt to say 'thank you' and 'please' in Cantonese resulted in him inadvertently ordering chicken feet for the table.



The students sat in prearranged seating according to Chinese dining customs, with the most respected member of the table sitting facing the entry. After considerable debate, it was agreed that Mr Higgins would occupy this 'seat of honour'.



There was a variety of non-meat dishes for some of the vegetarian girls, but most were tempted by the sight and smells of the large selection of prawn wontons and seafood dumplings. However, the highlight of our Cantonese dining experience was the mango pancake, with most students agreeing that this should be awarded 'best Yum Cha dish'.



Overall, the Society and Culture class learnt through first-hand experience the fantastic delights and delicacies of Chinese cultural dining and gained insight into the associated etiquette and values. A great day was had by all.

SUN SAFETY IN PDHPE

Sydneysiders have been lucky to have some very warm days to end winter and start spring. In the PDHPE Faculty there is no better time to be outdoors teaching our programs. However, with the warm weather comes the increased risk of skin damage from ultra-violet rays.

Australia has the highest rate of skin cancer in the world, and everyone needs to take care in the sun. Sunscreen is made available in all PDHPE lessons for students to use. Regular reminders are given to students to use this sunscreen and we recommend that students also wear the school cap when outside. When necessary, classes will be moved to shaded areas.

It is also important for adults to educate their children about the potentially harmful effects of the sun's rays. Children receive half a lifetime dose of UV rays in their first 15 years, so protection during their school years is vital.

We encourage parents to protect their children by reinforcing the importance of 'slip, slop, slap, seek and slide'.

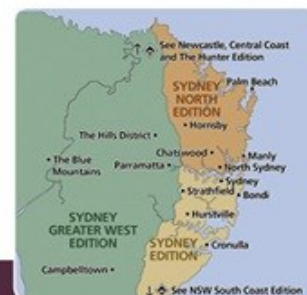
