## PRINCIPAL'S REPORT

#### **HSC Results**

I would like to congratulate the class of 2016 on their excellent HSC results. We scored 83 Band 6 results and a number of students have already received early offers from their Universities of choice.

In particular I would like to congratulate: **Adam** who has been listed on the Board of Studies Teaching and Educational Standards NSW (BOSTES) **All-Rounders List** as a student who has scored straight Band 6 results and received an ATAR of 98.45; and **Grace** who has been placed on the BOSTES **Top Achiever List** for ranking 2nd in the State in Extension 2 English. Grace achieved a perfect 50/50.

#### Year 12 2016 Celebration Breakfast

Today we hosted our traditional Year 12 Breakfast to celebrate their results and ATARs. Thank you to our students who braved the treacherous weather and made the effort to attend and share their HSC stories with us. We were very happy to be able to join with them to celebrate their success.

#### **Uniform Shop**

As I mentioned previously we have entered into a new partnership with The School Locker who will operate our new Uniform Shop located in the MPC. I am excited that we will be able to do this on site and make more of a connection between the school and our parent body.

The School Locker has included in this edition of Jumbunna information regarding the special operating hours in January and the regular hours from February onwards. There is also a price list. We have been told that our current suppliers have little stock available. The good news is that The School Locker has done an amazing job of ordering our stock - the suppliers have assured them that they will have the full range of our Summer Uniforms for the commencement of Term 1 next year. This would normally take 4-5 months to sample and produce - in fact they are flying stock in for us, at no extra cost, so that our school term can start well equipped. With this said, the timing on some items of our uniform may be delayed. If there is a delay, students will not be penalised for items that are unavailable. I thank you for your understanding and patience as we enter this exciting new venture.

On visiting the Uniform Shop for the first time each family will also be issued with a Student Advantage Card, which you should register online as soon as possible. This will ensure that the school receives a rebate on all purchases, to assist us with extra resources.

#### Farewell to our Valued Members of Staff

Sadly, the end of this term sees the retirement of three long standing and valued members of staff - Mr Peter Geaghan in the Industrial Arts faculty, Mr Peter Kneale in the English faculty and Ms Sue Whitlock our Teacher Librarian. These teachers have all made huge contributions to Pennant Hills High School. It is not just their pedagogical skill - the way they make difficult concepts not just accessible but more importantly transferable into every day life - but it is the relationships that they have built and invested in over their time at our school that sets them apart. Students are witness to the living example of the importance of maintaining effective relationships and the power that has in an educational setting.

Jackie Breden will also be taking up a secondment with BOSTES as a Senior Curriculum Advisor, Technology. We know Ms Breden has excellent skills and that she will put them to great use in her new role. I know the BOSTES are very excited to have her expertise on board and that Ms Breden is excited by this new challenge.

Thank you to the following students:


Year 10: Pume, Ishan, Patrick, Kieran and Vithusan; and Year 12 (before they graduated): Callum, Justin, William and Liam.










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## THE BIG BRIDGE DESIGN CHALLENGE

As part of the first Assessment Task for the HSC Engineering Studies course, students had to apply their knowledge of forces and truss analysis to design a bridge.

There were strict rules students had to follow in their designs. Each bridge:

- was only allowed to be made from 100 paddle pop sticks;
- had to span a distance of 350mm;
- could only be glued together with PVA wood glue; and
- had to have space for a matchbox car to drive over it.

The day of bridge testing was full of nerves, cheer and heartache. Students took turns to load weights through the centre point of their bridge until it failed and collapsed. Some failed very early whilst others proved extremely strong. Throughout the testing students were transfixed on the bridges and were continually talking about the failure point, discussing the different truss members being in compression or tension and where they believed the bridge would fail.

The bridges were tested to destruction as part of the task and judged on the amount of weight they could hold verses the weight of the bridge. An example of the strength the students were able to generate is one where the top bridge weighed 141 grams and was able to hold 55 kilograms.

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## A FINAL HOORAY FROM VISUAL ARTS FOR 2016



#### Cartoons and Sayings and Phrases

Year 7 have recently explored drawing cartoons. They had to create an environment into which they placed a goblin, fairy, Pegasus and a troll. The image had to tell a visual story.

Next they were given a page of sayings and we discussed the humour in the double meanings. They had to stress the *funny side* in their drawings.

We scanned the drawings and the class used Photoshop CS6 to add colour, draw with a variety of brushes and add text to the digital image.

Examples of the sayings or phrases included *raining cats and dogs, catching a bus, family pizza, hot dog, toasting the bride* and *making a pig of yourself.* It was a very successful unit with many amusing images created.

#### **Digital Cars**

Year 8 Visual Arts students recently extended their art making on cars by taking more photographs of the cars in the carpark. This time they uploaded the images into Photoshop CS6 and applied distortions of the hue and saturation, followed by a filter and finally a stroke. The printed digital images are wildly coloured and full of fun.

#### A FINAL HOORAY FROM VISUAL ARTS FOR 2016 continued

#### **Sculptures**

Year 8 have explored assembled sculpture by creating *Fantasy Mechanical Men & Women*. We collected a range of found objects: computer parts, bottle tops, screws, bolts and wire etc. The students started with a wooden block for the body and flat piece of wood for the base. They selected objects from the collection and lay them on the table to work out how they would put it together. Then the fun part of joining the pieces started. Holes were drilled and the students could tie, glue or use the hot glue gun to assemble their sculpture. Metallic paint was used to unify the form and detail of small mechanical parts developed the mechanical theme. The final work was photographed and displayed in the foyer. They all looked fabulous.



#### Year 10 Flight

We explored the theme of *Flight* in Term 4. This unit prepares them for when they have to create a Body of Work in Year 12. We research a variety of ways the concept of flight has been used in Visual Art through time. Year 10 were encouraged to experiment with any media area that interested them eg. drawing, painting, coloured inks, printing, sculpture and digital media - any media that we had in the Visual Arts faculty. Their topic only had to relate to the theme and could be literal or conceptual. The class has happily run with the program and are producing pleasing works which will be exhibited in next year's CAPA Festival Art Exhibition.
