# **STUDENT ENCAPSULATES THE ANZAC SPIRIT**

PENNANT Hills High School student Matthew Pines knows a trip to France and Belgium next year will make his passion for war history even more fascinating.

The 16-year-old Westleigh student has won the 2018 Premier's Anzac Memorial Scholarship tour, which will see him join other NSW peers on a trip of a lifetime to the former war fields of France and Belgium.

His personal interest was piqued when he found out his great-grandfather Martin Cleveland Pines served in both world wars, and he is now the first student from his school to win the scholarship.

"I have always wanted to visit the battlefields of World War I and I love learning about WWII," he said. "My great-grandfather was in the 6th Australian Light Horse Regiment and the 1st Light Car Patrol."

Matthew is a leading seaman in the Australian Navy Cadets and umpires in junior AFL games.

Hornsby state Liberal MP Matt Kean said Matthew's submission to the judges was impressive.

"I congratulate Matthew on all his hard work in putting his outstanding submission video together," Mr Kean said.

"He has captured the Anzac spirit perfectly. This is a once-In-a-lifetime chance to walk in the footsteps of the Anzacs, touring battlegrounds and seeing first hand where Australians fought for this country."





