



PRINCIPAL'S REPORT

Dylan

Today I joined a significant number of staff, students, friends, family and members of our local community to farewell and celebrate the life of Dylan.



Dylan tragically passed away in a car accident last week. He was a sensitive, caring and well-loved student. Dylan worked hard at maintaining the relationships he developed with friends, peers and teachers. He was well respected in his year group and had friends across our school as well as other schools. Dylan built his relationships on trust, honesty and a fantastic smile. He is remembered for his kindness to those he came into contact with.

Our thoughts are with Dylan's family at this extremely difficult time.

Schools Spectacular

Bushfire Risk Mitigation Works

In the past two weeks we have been undergoing some significant bushfire risk mitigation works on our grounds. Pennant Hills High School is in a high risk zone, as determined by the Department of Education (DoE) in association with the Rural Fire Service (RFS). We are not the only school that has had this work undertaken, as the DoE have been managing routine maintenance for Asset Protection Zones to comply with NSW RFS Asset Protection Zone Standards across the State.

The work done to ensure that we were compliant was significant. I am very aware of the disappointment felt by many parents, particularly those who so generously contributed to the Great Penno Reno (GPR) and our GPR Committee. As Principal and Manager of the site, I have spoken with the Department and requested a meeting to ensure that, moving forward, we can work together towards a mutually agreeable compromise for future works, whilst still remaining compliant with the legislation. The DoE are committed to working with us so that our precious gardens can be protected where possible. I am confident that we can collectively work towards a positive outcome.

I thank our P&C for their continued support and commitment to our school.

YEAR 9 VISUAL ARTS

Year 9 have Created Fantasy Ceramic Cakes in Visual Arts. We studied two artists, Oldenberg, who made cake sculptures, and Thiebald, who painted cakes in oil paint on canvas. For the fantasy element we looked at Blackman and his Alice in Wonderland series.













The students researched cakes on the internet for ideas and sketched a proposed fantasy cake. Clay joining techniques were discussed and they created a paper pattern for their cake. Clay was rolled out and they cut, joined and decorated their sculpture over a number of weeks. It was placed on racks to dry over the holidays, then fired in the kiln to 1100 degrees to make it permanent. Interest was added by painting the cakes black first followed by colour on top to highlight the different cake textures of cake, cream or icing etc. A gloss spray gave them a finished look.

We celebrated the completion of the unit with a party with cake and drinks. They will make a great display at the Annual Visual Arts Exhibition in 2019. Well done Year 9!




