
Student Name: Prajna Channa




Student Name: Tahlia Harris


Student Name: Emma Loch


Student Name: Carys Milligan

Media Area: Collection of Works



Title of Artwork: Being Embraced


Media Area: Photomedia

Media Area: Painting

Statement of Intent: The state of our coral reefs has become a cause for concern, ever-increasing in urgency since the first mass coral bleaching event in 1983. My artwork articulates the devastating impact that mass coral death from multiple bleaching events has had on fragile ocean ecosystems, leading to a domino effect in food chains caused by the reduction of habitats that ensure survival of marine species. Thousands of marine animals depend on coral reefs to survive, meaning that the impact of these events is massive, and the increasing incidence of them will result in the reduction of biodiversity and extinction of our precious marine life.


Student Name: Tyler Van Dyk

Student Name: Joss Aston-Louis Title of Play: 'The Visit' Individual Project: Costume


Statement: In today's materialistic society, the idea that individuals will shift their core beliefs and values for wealth is becoming more and more common. I wanted to channel this theme through the use of costume design in the play The Visit. Friedrich Dürrenmatt's play The Visit tells the story of an enormously wealthy woman, Claire Zachanassian, returning to her hometown with a dreadful proposition; the townspeople of Gullen must kill Alfred; the man who got her pregnant and then abandoned her. In exchange for his murder, she will provide enough money to revitalize the decaying town. The Visit explores this idea of money and it's corrupting influence, through the town of Gullen's morals becoming shifted at the chance of financial gain. I use costume to explore this with the use of dark and light colours, structured and unstructured silhouettes and expensive and cheap fabrics to represent the shift from innocence and naivety to corruption and guilt.



Student Name: Hamish Campbell Title of Monologue: Teaching Macbeth Individual Project: Monologue

Statement: As a teacher, you always hope you have a class that listens and contributes to the lesson. Well, for my character, it is their worst nightmare when everything goes wrong. For starters he arrives late, secondly, the Head-Teacher is in the front row bearing down on him, and finally his class does not listen or contribute!!! The Holy Trinity of hell, some may say! For me, this is hopefully not my reality if I achieve my

dream of becoming a teacher, but who knows until I make it. Through my performance of *Teaching Macbeth*, I explore the highs and lows of a teacher and, through this performance, I indulge myself as a teacher myself. In my performance I draw upon Commedia dell'arte with the stock characters of El Capitano through my high and low moments and Zanni through my persona being highly animated through my movements on stage. Through my performance I explore my own identity and passion for teaching, in this case Shakespeare's Macbeth, and soldiering on despite being "tainted with fear". I have been able to discover a human experience through my monologue of Teaching Macbeth - of what teachers go through on a daily basis in which they welcome hell everyday when they teach.



Student Name: Evelyne Dowsett Title of Monologue: "Cool Girl" Individual Project: Monologue

Statement: The notion of the perfect woman has been presented to us for hundreds of years through the representation of women in our media through the male gaze. The modern version that many of us are familiar with is the "Cool Girl", who is an idolised masculine stereotype in a beautiful woman's body. Amy Dunne is one of these women that tried to fit into these unrealistic standards of the "Cool Girl", but when her marriage crumbles we see the darkness behind the perfect facade that she has worn for six years. Nick is about to get his life turned upside down and we are forced to ask ourselves, whose side do we take? My monologue has been inspired by Stanislavski and using physicality in order to demonstrate control or lack thereof. I have emphasised the character's rigid personality through sharp movements and I have enjoyed exploring the character's motivation through body language and building tension with focus.



Student Name: Tahlia Harris Title of Monologue: A Psychopath Individual Project: Monologue

Statement: For a normal person being in a holding cell isn't the ideal way to spend their time. especially if you've been wrongly accused. But as you soon learn what Alanna has done to get to where she is, what you think about what Alanna has done is up to you if you think it was deliberate or not. By the end of the monologue your opinion might have changed about her and you might then start to understand what her motive for what Alanna has done and why she killed all those people. There's a reason behind what Alanna has done and there's a valid reason as to why everything happened. Maybe Alanna shouldn't have killed all those innocent people, but maybe they weren't all innocent, and maybe some of them deserved to get what they got at the end of the day. Or maybe it wasn't all their fault, maybe it was my parents and how they raised me or at the end of the day maybe it was everyone's fault in their own way. My monologue explores the reasons behind a psychopath and why they do, what they do and how you might hate them at times, but by the end you might have remorse for my character. It's up to you in the end to make of it what you will and judge me as you see fit.



Student Name: Euan Howells Title of Monologue: 'Free Drink' Individual Project: Monologue

Statement: For the average person the death of a parent is a loss of a crucial relationship in their life that can't be replaced, as the unconditional love of a parent is something we all cherish and sometimes take for granted. However, for victims of abusive parents, it is a loss of hope of making any happy memories to remember them by as well as a moment of 'clearing the air', resolving past conflicts and traumas. My monologue explores this harsh truth as Bojack Horseman struggles with the pain of letting go of his Mother. Left only with the baggage of unresolved arguments, unspoken words and words that can't be taken back; Bojack delivers his unprepared eulogy for his Mother, projecting conflicting feelings of remorse and sheer bitterness. In preparation for this monologue, I researched the psychological effects of parental abuse and drew from Stanislavski questions to develop my character's purpose and motivation. I was also inspired by the style of Black Comedy, utilising comedic timing and movement to confront the audience with the dark humour that Bojack uses as a coping mechanism for his emotions. Statement: Sean is having another normal day at the police office, but his interests are raised when he comes across a strange suspect during an interrogation. What seems to be a normal interrogation becomes unexpected and mysterious. Sean's day turns out to not be so normal anymore. A short interrogation style film inspired from scenes in Zack Snyder's *Watchmen, Christopher Nolan's The Dark Night* and *Ava Duvernay's When They See Us.* The story is shared between both characters Sean and Steven, and the audience learns more about each character as they engage with each other throughout the constant back and forth dialogue.
