


Instructions for Subject Selection for 2020 Timetable

Student Name, you are invited to choose subjects using your unique login code: **Web Code**



Go to the following web address <https://spring.edval.education/login> and enter your webcode. When successfully logged in a screen like the one shown below will open.

Guidelines to use when selecting courses for year 11

1. Your first selection must be English then you choose subjects from Priority 1 onward.
 - i. Final decision on acceptance into English Advanced will be made by HT English. Students who rank in the top 40 will be offered a place in the course.
2. Stage 5.3 is a prerequisite for Mathematics Advanced. Final decision on acceptance will be made by HT Mathematics.
3. You are only able to select a maximum of TWO 1 unit courses for 2020.
 - i. With the exception of English Extension and Mathematics Extension all other one unit course only run for year 11.
 - ii. Final decision on acceptance into English Extension and Mathematics Extension will be made by HT English and Mathematics respectively.
 - iii. English Extension and Mathematics Extension may be scheduled outside the normal school timetable (offline)
4. Select main units in order of priority (i.e. the courses you would like most to do in rank order)
5. You are also to choose THREE reserve preferences. These will be used, if necessary if, you do not get a main choice/s to complete the minimum requirement of 12 units of study.
6. When you have entered and submitted your final selections on the web choices page, you will need to print off a copy of your subject selection for 2020 and hand in a signed copy to Mr Phull / Mr Keegan

Only select a subject in Priority 6 if you have not reached the minimum requirement of 12 units of study

Note:

- You can go to the website <https://spring.edval.education/login> and change your selection as many times as you wish until midnight, Wednesday 14th August. At this time selections are final and cannot be changed.
- Only students who do not receive the minimal requirement of 12 units of study will be contacted regarding their choices.
- It is important to understand that 1 unit subjects (excluding Extension English and Extension Mathematics) run in year 11 ONLY. This means if you choose a 1 unit Board Endorsed course in year 11 you will only have 11 units of study in year 12 (if a single 1 unit course is chosen) or 10 units (if two 1 unit courses are chosen). The HSC requires a minimum of 10 units of study in year 12.

Subjects with recommended prior knowledge

Subject	Assumed understanding
English Advanced	Achieved a minimum of a B grade (75/100) in Stage 5 English
English Extension	A highly accomplished Advanced English student
Mathematics Advanced	Achieved a minimum of a B grade (75/100) in Stage 5 Mathematics (5.3 course)
Mathematics Extension	A highly accomplished Advanced Mathematics student
Physics	It is highly recommended that this course is undertaken in conjunction with Advanced Mathematics as a minimum requirement.
Music	Highly recommended that you have experience in a musical instrument or performance
Languages (continuers)	Have studied chosen language in Stage 5 and achieved a B grade (75/100) in the course

Subjects with Major Work requirements

Students should consider how many subjects they choose that require a major project and how they will best manage their time.

Community and Family Studies	Personal Interest Project
Drama	Major performance piece
Industrial Technology (Timber and Metal)	Major project and portfolio
Music	Major performance piece
Society and Culture	Personal Interest Project
Textiles and Design	Major project and portfolio
Visual Arts	Major project and portfolio
